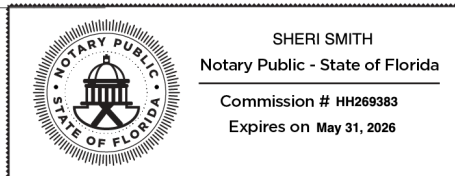

Agenda Item 1. CALL TO ORDER, ROLL CALL. The meeting of the Nebraska State Records Board (“NSRB”) was called to order by Chairperson Robert B. Evnen at 9:01 a.m. on January 8, 2026.

Agenda Item 8. AUDIT OF NEBRASKA INTERACTIVE, LLC. Mr. Foley reported that the Finance Review Subcommittee reviewed the audit of Nebraska Interactive, LLC dba Tyler Nebraska (“Tyler Nebraska”) for years ending December 31, 2024, and 2023. The Finance Review Subcommittee unanimously recommended the NSRB approve receipt of the audit.

Agenda Item 9. PROJECT UPDATE

Agenda Item 9.a. Artificial Intelligence Chatbot Pilot Project. Mr. O’Flaherty with Tyler Nebraska demonstrated the Resident Assistant Artificial Intelligence (“AI”) Chatbot (“Chatbot”) custom tailored for the Department of Motor Vehicles (“DMV”). Mr. O’Flaherty reported that over the last 28 days, there have been 11,000 unique users of the Chatbot, and more than 25,000 questions have been submitted. Mr. O’Flaherty reported that feedback received has been positive. There was discussion on call deflection data. Mr. Hughes stated that Tyler Nebraska plans to provide additional information and data on the use and effectiveness of the Chatbot at the next NSRB meeting.

Rhonda Lahm, Director the DMV, explained that the Chatbot was initially deployed in an unannounced manner and was organically adopted for use. Early performance results suggest meaningful customer service value. The DMV is actively tracking call center volume data and metrics. However, the pilot has been of limited duration, and DMV anticipates having more meaningful data after the first quarter of the year. Ms. Lahm commended Tyler Nebraska and DMV staff for the successful implementation of the Chatbot.

Agenda Item 10. EXECUTIVE DIRECTOR’S REPORT

Agenda Item 10.a. Review of Template Agreements. Ms. Elder provided a list of agreements signed pursuant to NSRB authority, including Electronic Government Service Level Agreements, PayPort and Citizen Payment Processing addendums, and Statements of Work.

Ms. Elder also reported a termination agreement for the City of St. Paul, Revised Addendum One for DMV, and Addendum 19 for the Nebraska Supreme Court prepared in response to the Supreme Court’s adjustments to fees for online court services, effective January 1, 2026.

Agenda Item 11. PROJECT PRIORITY REPORT & REVIEW OF PROJECT STATUS REPORTS

Action Item 11.a. Project Priority Report Mr. Hughes reported changes to the Project Priority report to address NSRB member requests for additional information. Ms. Erb noted the reports now include reasons for realignment of project completion dates. Ms. Erb discussed projects completed in December, including major projects for Agriculture, State Fire Marshal, State Patrol, and DMV.

Ms. Erb reported on a project cancelled for the DMV and shared that Tyler Nebraska has many additional projects in the pipeline.

Ms. Elder presented Project Status reports, which include project feedback received from state and local government entities. Ms. Elder highlighted a status report provided by the Nebraska Brand Committee.

There was discussion of third-party reasons for realignment of project completion dates. Mr. Will would like to identify patterns in third-party issues causing delay. There was discussion of use of an asterisk in the report to indicate the estimated completion date has been revised. Mr. Jackson would like to understand the degree of change in the anticipated completion date, and so would like the report to include the original completion dates.

Agenda Item 12.a. Business Plan Amendment. Mr. Hughes presented an amendment to the 2025 Business Plan for Tyler Nebraska, which will continue the 2025 plan for the next quarter of services, or the first quarter of 2026. Mr. Hughes discussed modernization, elevation of citizen journey, driving AI innovation, and improvement of the process for completion of PCI compliance documentation. There was discussion of merchant and payment processing costs.

Agenda Item 12.b. Outage Report – DMV Certificates of Completion. Mr. Hughes explained that an outage occurred between September 10, 2025, and September 12, 2025, when a secure Virtual Private Network (“VPN”) connection between the State’s network and Tyler Nebraska’s cloud environment. The traffic stopped moving between the VPN and Tyler Nebraska, but the VPN remained up. The only service affected was the DMV Certificates of Completion. The issue was remedied by a restart on the State’s side.

Agenda Item 12.c. Status of Technical Infrastructure Upgrades, Migrations and Enhancements. Mr. Sloan provided an update on Tyler Nebraska’s Grails and website modernization efforts. Mr. Sloan reported that Tyler’s commitment to the State to complete the modernization work within 6-8 quarters has been fulfilled. Tyler’s marketing team created a case study of Nebraska’s modernization project, which discusses a technology shift in movement of legacy applications to a forward-facing, sustainable, and scalable platform.

Agenda Item 12.d. General Manager’s Report. Mr. Hughes reported the results of Tyler Nebraska’s annual disaster recovery test for the State of Nebraska. There was discussion of the failover processes and change management processes to ensure successful failover. Mr. Hughes also discussed completion of enhancements for the Department of Revenue Tax Payment Plan system.

Agenda Item 13. REQUEST FOR PROPOSALS – NETWORK MANAGER DISCUSSION (Closed Session). Mr. Blocher moved that the NSRB go into closed session for the limited purpose of discussion of the Request for Proposals for a Network Manager, and indicated the closed session was necessary for the protection of the public interest and prevention of needless injury to the reputation of an individual. The motion for closed session was seconded by Mr. Kelly. Chairperson Evnen restated the motion to go into closed session.

Mr. Jackson asked why a closed session is necessary. Ms. Elder explained that the scoring information is not yet public and that bidder performance may be discussed.

**Electronic Government Service Level Agreement
with
Knox County, Nebraska**

This Agreement is made by and among Nebraska Interactive, LLC, dba NIC Nebraska, a Nebraska Limited Liability Company (“the Contractor”), the Nebraska State Records Board (the “NSRB”), and Knox County, Nebraska, a state governmental entity or political subdivision of Nebraska (“the Partner”).

This agreement memorializes supplements to the State of Nebraska Contract between the NSRB and the Contractor (“Master Contract”) effective April 1, 2019, which concerns the operation and management of the Portal. This Agreement is subordinate to the Master Contract and is subject to all terms and conditions therein.

WHEREAS, the Partner is a state governmental entity or political subdivision of Nebraska that desires to utilize the Master Contract; and

WHEREAS, the Contractor desires to extend Master Contract services to the Partner.

NOW, THEREFORE, in consideration of the mutual conditions, covenants, and premises contained in this Agreement, the parties agree as follows:

1. PURPOSE – The purpose of this Agreement is to grant the Contractor access and authority to provide services permitted by the Master Contract and electronically collect data for the purpose of providing digital services, which may include interface and database development, application development and support, Electronic Services for payment processing, payment processing hardware and support, and other services permitted by the Master Contract, and to set forth conditions and responsibilities associated with such services. Any desired services and associated charges or fees will be set forth in an addendum to this Agreement; *provided, however,* to the extent the parties desire for the Contractor to provide services to the Partner on a time and materials basis, the parties hereto will execute a separate Statement of Work for such services.
2. APPLICATION SUPPORT
 - a. The Contractor agrees to provide support to users who require access to an online service set forth in an addendum to this Agreement. Such support shall include answering the user’s technical questions and addressing problems related to screen or report formats, codes, abbreviations, billing policy, error messages, problems and other access concerns.
 - b. The parties agree that the Partner will be responsible for answering all user questions related to the Partner’s business processes, as well as the Partner’s rules and regulations, policies and procedures applicable to an addendum to this Agreement.
 - c. The Contractor agrees to participate in all meetings that the Partner identifies as necessary in order for the Contractor to provide a high level of customer support. The Partner agrees to supply the Contractor with all information necessary to assist user as indicated above.
 - d. The Partner agrees to grant access to information necessary for the Contractor to perform updates or maintenance for electronic access to public records for services set forth in addenda related to this Agreement.
 - e. The Partner agrees to update and inform the Contractor on substantive changes in the law relating to electronic services provided by the Contractor.

3. CHANGES IN PORTAL – Unless there is an agreement otherwise, the parties will provide thirty (30) days written notice of any planned, material changes in Portal operations affecting the Partner’s online service. A “material change” is defined as a change that adds to the complexity of an application or diminishes the services provided. These changes will include, but are not limited to file format changes, changes in data transfer and retrieval procedures, application coding changes, URL migrations and interface content changes.
4. PARTNER’S FEES – The Partner is responsible for correctly calculating any of its fees and providing the Contractor those fee calculations. The Contractor will not assume liability for Partner application fee miscalculations that the Partner approved as functionally correct. The Contractor will also not assume liability for the Partner’s fee miscalculations due to system errors not caused by any act or omission on the part of the Contractor.
5. TECHNOLOGY STANDARD – The Contractor shall review the Nebraska Technology Access Standards, found at <http://nitc.nebraska.gov/standards/> and ensure that products and/or services provided under the Agreement are in compliance or will comply with the applicable standards.
6. CONFIDENTIALITY – All materials and information provided by the Partner or acquired by the Contractor on behalf of the Partner shall be regarded as confidential information and treated as described in Section I.KK of the Master Contract. All materials and information provided by the Partner or acquired by the Contractor on behalf of the Partner shall be handled in accordance with Federal and State Law. The Contractor shall treat, and shall require that its agents, employees, affiliates, parent company, and subcontractors treat such materials or information as confidential, as required by Federal and State Law. The Contractor shall not be responsible for treatment contrary to State and Federal Law by the State, any agency, members of the public, or others not under the Contractor’s control.
7. AGREEMENT REPRESENTATIVES AND NOTICES – All matters relating to this Agreement shall be directed to the following persons. Each party may change these designations following written notice from each party to the other party to this Agreement.

8. TERMINATION OF AGREEMENT –

- a. Either the Partner or the Contractor shall have the right to terminate this Agreement or any addendum, for cause, subject to cure, by providing written notice of termination, to the other parties. Such notice shall specify the cause, including citation to any specific provision of this Agreement, which gives rise to the notice and shall specify action that the other party can take to avoid termination of the Agreement or any addendum. Unless agreed otherwise, the parties shall have sixty (60) days or less to cure any breach of contract.

For purposes of this Agreement, the phrase “for cause” shall mean any material breach by any party to this Agreement of the terms or conditions of this Agreement and any addendum.

In any material breach by any party to this Agreement, the rights to pursue all remedies are available to the parties under the State Contract Claims Act.

- b. At the option of the Contractor and with thirty (30) days advance written notice to the Partner and NSRB, the Contractor may terminate an addendum to this Agreement for a particular service if:
 - i. There is insufficient interest in such service as demonstrated by low use and inadequate funding; or
 - ii. The Partner continually fails to update and make necessary information available to the Contractor as required by this Agreement.

9. TERM OF AGREEMENT – This Agreement shall commence on the date of execution by all parties and shall terminate with the Master Contract and any extensions or renewals thereof, unless earlier terminated in accordance with the terms of this Agreement.

10. RELATIONSHIP OF PARTIES – Notwithstanding any other provisions contained herein, it is expressly agreed that the Contractor is an Independent Contractor in the performance of every part of this Agreement and not an agent or employee of the NSRB or the Partner.

11. CHANGES, MODIFICATIONS OR AMENDMENTS – This Agreement may be changed, modified or amended at any time by an instrument in writing signed by the NSRB, the Contractor and the Partner.

12. MARKETING – The Partner may provide reasonable marketing space in its publications (if or when such exists) at no charge, to allow the Contractor’s promotion of Portal services.

13. EXHIBIT SPACE – The Partner may provide NSRB or the Contractor complimentary exhibit space or speaker time at any appropriate conventions or seminars, which the Partner may host.

14. ELECTRONIC SERVICES FOR PAYMENT PROCESSING (if applicable)

- a. INTERFACE AND DATABASE DEVELOPMENT – Upon execution of an addendum to this Agreement, the Contractor will provide access to its customer-friendly interface to accept and complete user Electronic Payments and provide appropriate reporting to the Partner offices. The Contractor will provide online access to the Partner to view transactions for any particular day or cumulative timeframe and their subsequent status via the Internet.
- b. SWIPE HARDWARE PROVISION AND SUPPORT
 - i. To the extent permitted by law, scope of the Master Contract, and NSRB policy, if the Partner would like for the Contractor to provide swipe hardware, the parties shall agree in an addendum the details of the swipe hardware to be provided, and whether or not the swipe hardware provided will be paid for and owned by Partner or the Contractor. The Contractor shall provide hardware support for payment processing service cards or swipe hardware, if such hardware is used by Partner and if it has been obtained through the Contractor. Such support shall be directed to answering Partner questions and resolving problems related to installation, use of the check/card swipe hardware, codes, abbreviations, and error messages.
 - ii. The Contractor shall repair or replace any of its defective card swipe hardware provided to the Partner under this Agreement. If required, the Contractor will ship the replacement card-swipe hardware to the Partner within two business days.
 - iii. The Contractor agrees to participate in all meetings that the Partner identifies as necessary in order for providing hardware service support. The Partner agrees to supply the Contractor with all information (within Partner’s control) necessary to aid the Contractor in assisting the Partner’s staff users at the Service hardware support level agreed above.
- c. COSTS AND COMPUTER SYSTEMS FOR ELECTRONIC PAYMENT – The Contractor shall be responsible for all costs in supplying electronic payment reports and payment-transaction confirmation numbers to the user. This includes the cost for the Contractor’s interface with the Partner’s system in order to provide such electronic payment reports and user payment-transaction confirmation number. Such system shall:
 - i. Supply the payment confirmation number to the user in an understandable and logical format acceptable to the Partner;
 - ii. Supply reports to the Partner in an understandable and logical format; and
 - iii. The Contractor’s interface with the Partner’s system will be tested against functional criteria across multiple operating system devices and browsers and 508 accessibility standards, reviewed by the Contractor and Partner, and finally approved by the designated Partner before it is offered to the user.
- d. ONLINE CARD SECURITY – To the extent applicable, each of the parties shall be required to comply at all times with the Payment Card Industry Data Security Standard Program (“PCI-DSS”). The parties acknowledge that each party is responsible for the security of cardholder data in its possession. The parties agree to maintain a list of PCI DSS requirements that the Contractor administers and the requirements that are the Partner’s responsibility. If the Partner operates swipe

hardware, it shall be responsible for compliance with PCI DSS version 3.1 or the most current versions regarding the swipe hardware, including, but not limited to, the maintenance, inspection, and training obligations set forth in PCI DSS Requirement 9.9.

- e. PAYMENT OF FEES – Users of payment services set forth in an addendum to this Agreement will have several payment methods provided by the Contractor. The following outlines the Agreement for these payment methods.
 - i. Credit Card and Electronic Check Payments through State-Selected Processor – The Partner funds collected through the Portal shall be deposited by the credit card, debit card and other electronic payment processor selected by the State Treasurer and Director of Administrative Services directly into a state or national bank account selected by the State Treasurer. The State Treasurer shall designate the acquirer financial institution. Any Portal Fee collected for a Partner service through the Portal shall be deposited directly in an account selected by the State Treasurer and disbursed from the State’s distributive account to the Contractor within three (3) business days.
 - ii. Credit Card and Electronic Check Payments through the Contractor-Selected Processor – If the Partner is a political subdivision that does not elect to use the processor selected by the State Treasurer and Director of Administrative Services, this subsection shall apply in lieu of Section 14(e)(i). The Contractor may use its direct contract with a processor to process such funds and deposit funds in the Contractor’s bank account. Political subdivision funds will be disbursed to the appropriate Partner bank account within three (3) business days of the Contractor receiving such funds. The Contractor shall provide the Partner a detailed accounting report (with sensitive identifying information removed) showing all receipts and disbursements described in this section.
 - iii. Return or Chargeback –If a return or chargeback is received, user may incur an additional \$15.00 charge by the Contractor for the recovery of the handling and processing of these returns or chargebacks. The amount charged by the Contractor for the recovery of the handling and processing of these returns or chargebacks is subject to change without notification to the Partner. The Contractor will provide the Partner online access to a report detailing all returns or chargebacks and reasons for the returns or chargebacks on each business day.
 - iv. Refunds – The Partner will initiate refunds (funds credited back to the customer) up to the amount of the statutory or other fee due to the Partner based on the method provided by the Contractor. Online fees are non-refundable. Refunds will be deducted from future Partner disbursements based on the transaction date of the refund.
 - v. Credit Card Chargebacks – The Contractor will be responsible for the initial handling and recovery of all monies associated with chargebacks. In the event the Contractor is unable to collect funds within 60 days from receipt of notice, chargeback will be deducted from a future Partner disbursement from the State Treasurer or the Contractor. The Partner will then be responsible for any business process needed to recover funds for chargebacks.
 - vi. Check Returns – Returned checks will be deducted from future Partner Disbursement at the time the return is processed from the State Treasurer or

the Contractor. The Partner will be responsible for collection of any returned checks due to insufficient funds, closed accounts, etc.

- vii. Fees – The Contractor will be responsible for all electronic check processing fees, all credit card merchant account fees and chargeback account fees for the merchant ID and for the Partner merchant ID unless otherwise set forth in an addendum to this Agreement.
 - viii. Subscription Services –the Contractor will provide subscription services in accordance with terms and conditions set forth in the Master Contract, Section II.U.3 (CUSTOMER PAYMENT PROCESSING REQUIREMENTS), and any amendments.
- f. RECORDS AND FINANCES – All the Contractor’s documents and records relating to Electronic Payment transactions made via the Contractor’s payment processing service shall be available for inspection and auditing in accordance with the audit requirements of the Master Contract.
15. EXISTING SERVICES – All addenda for existing services between the Contractor and the Partner executed prior to the effective date of the Master Contract shall remain in full force and effect under this new Agreement unless cancelled, terminated, amended, or it expires under its own term and shall be considered addenda to this new Agreement.
16. ENTIRE AGREEMENT – This Agreement constitutes the complete and exclusive statement of the agreement among the parties hereto and supersedes all other prior written or oral contracts between the parties with respect to the subject matter hereof.
17. GOVERNING LAW –The laws and statutes of the State of Nebraska shall govern this Agreement.
18. SEVERABILITY – If a court of competent jurisdiction declares any of this Agreement’s terms or conditions to be invalid or illegal, the remaining terms and conditions shall remain valid, and the parties’ rights and obligations shall be construed and enforced as if the Agreement did not contain the particular provision held to be invalid.
19. ORDER OF PRECEDENCE – If an inconsistency exists with the documents of this Agreement, the inconsistency will be resolved by giving precedence in the order indicated to the following:
- a. Any amendments to the Master Contract
 - b. The Master Contract
 - c. An addendum to this Agreement
 - d. This Agreement
20. APPLICATION ENGINE TERMS – The applications and services developed by the Contractor pursuant to this Agreement may be developed using a proprietary application development platform (the “Application Engine”). For purposes of this Agreement, the Application Engine will be deemed as an Electronic Service under the terms of the Master Contract. Custom-developed applications and services created using the Application Engine pursuant to this Agreement will be deemed to be Software under the terms of the Master Contract. Upon issuance of the license contemplated in Section II.O the Master Contract, the Contractor, in addition to such license, shall deliver to the State, Object Files containing the then-current version of Application Engine (the “Application Engine Object Files”). Upon delivery of the Application Engine Object Files, the Contractor shall grant to the State a

perpetual, for use only, fully paid-up, non-transferable, non-exclusive, license to host (in object code only), copy and use the Application Engine for the sole purpose of operating, maintaining and modifying any Software developed using the Application Engine pursuant to this Agreement.

21. GOV2GO TERMS – If the Partner has chosen for the Contractor to utilize Gov2Go Platform (as defined below) in the performance of the Contractor’s services hereunder, the following terms apply.
- a. “Gov2Go Platform” is a citizen-centric national platform, which functions as a digital personal assistant for citizens to interact with multiple levels of government throughout the United States. The Gov2Go Platform aggregates integrated web and mobile applications and delivers them through a single user experience. The Gov2Go Platform is accessible on the web and through multiple mobile platforms. The Gov2Go Platform will facilitate certain citizen with government entities, including transactions and the provision of information.
 - b. The Gov2Go Platform is an Electronic Service under the Master Contract and will be primarily hosted in an industry-leading public cloud environment.
 - c. This Agreement authorizes the Contractor to provide services through its hardware, software and network infrastructure hosted by the Contractor, its affiliates or service providers, to:
 - (1) Connect the Partner’s designated systems or data sources to the Gov2Go Platform,
 - (2) Facilitate access to the Partner information and sites through the Gov2Go Platform,
 - (3) Facilitate certain governmental licensing, registration, tax payments and other government transactions through the Gov2Go Platform,
 - (4) Authorize and capture credit and debit cards through the Gov2Go Platform using the State’s payment processor or NIC’s payment processor, as applicable,
 - (5) Process all other forms of Electronic Funds Transfer using the State’s payment processor or NIC’s payment processor, as applicable, and
 - (6) Manage the registration of users and the online transaction logging data, and the billing and collecting of funds, for users of fee services.
 - d. The services also include such other digital services as may be from time to time developed by the Contractor or its affiliates outside of the Master Contract and made available to Partner through this Agreement. The services provided hereunder shall be provided as Electronic Services.
 - e. Partner Intellectual Property – All intellectual property developed by or provided by the Partner under this Agreement (the “Partner Intellectual Property”) shall remain the sole and exclusive property of the Partner. The Partner shall exclusively have all ownership and all intellectual property rights. All content and all State Property, data and information furnished by the Partner to the Contractor shall remain property of the Partner.
 - f. The Contractor’s Intellectual Property – All intellectual property, including but not limited to Software, developed or provided by or on behalf of the Contractor or its affiliates prior to or during the term of the Master Contract, that utilize or are provided through Gov2Go Platform (the “Contractor’s Intellectual Property”) shall be

the sole and exclusive property of The Contractor or its affiliates, as applicable, and the Contractor and its affiliates shall exclusively have all ownership thereto and all intellectual property and proprietary rights therein. All content and all property, data and information furnished by the Contractor or its affiliates to Partner to facilitate the Contractor’s performance of this Agreement shall remain property of the Contractor or its affiliates, as applicable.

- g. Ownership of Data – Data regarding transactions processed on behalf of the State shall be governed by the Master Contract, including Paragraph E of Section I thereof. Any data collected by the Contractor or an affiliate through the Gov2Go Platform that is not directly connected to an interaction or transaction with the State shall be owned by the Contractor, its affiliate, or another governmental entity, as applicable. Partner acknowledges that the Gov2Go Platform is a national product and therefore data will be collected by the Gov2Go Platform that is not directly related to an interaction or transaction with the State.

Upon submission by Users, the permit data is transmitted to the Partner’s mainframe database, where it is used to support regulatory oversight and ensure compliance with the Nebraska Seed Law (Neb. Rev. Stat. §§81-2,147 to 81-2,147.12) (“Seed Law”).

To further reduce paper-based processes and improve the efficiency and scope of permit data collection, the Partner has requested an enhancement to the existing online service. This enhancement will modernize the workflow, streamline data capture, and better support NDA’s regulatory responsibilities.

2 Project Overview

2.1 Objectives

The Contractor will modify an existing permit renewal form and create an online portal (“Portal”) that will serve as the central platform, utilizing mail queue to send renewal emails and eliminate NDA’s paper-based process. The Portal will enhance the amount of data collected, allowing for better control over permit information. Once a renewal form is submitted, the correct amount due, plus any applicable late fees, will be calculated, and payment will be allowed by the User.

Data will be sent daily to NDA’s systems, AS400, and OnBase. Enhancing the renewal form will streamline the process and move it to the Portal, where Partner can easily manage the information needed to be in compliance with the Seed Law.

2.2 Scope

2.2.1 Inclusions

2.2.1.1 An online form that meets the Partner’s business requirements, including but not limited to, automatically populating answers to fields/questions from prior year’s data, and adding fields to capture corporation and firm information.



- 2.2.1.2 Improved data mapping for corporation and firm information and setting up the connection to send data to AS400 and OnBase nightly.
- 2.2.1.3 Mail queue to send permit renewal emails, which will include the same information in the current permit renewal letter, or information as designated by Partner.
- 2.2.1.4 Adding permit validation to fill out the form, and a new option for Users to print their permit.
- 2.2.1.5 A workflow that sends an automated email to the User with the PDF of the form, which will also include an option to update personal information (not impacting seed answers) and automatically email an administrator at NDA for notification of an information change.
- 2.2.1.6 Review of payment setup and adjustments, if applicable, to ensure it is accurately configured to support the late fee structure and corporation billing.
- 2.2.1.7 Creating an administrator view, which can be used by Partner, as requested by Partner.

2.3 Terminology

When used herein, capitalized words shall have the respective meanings set forth below:

- 2.3.1 **Must** - The function or referenced object must meet the desired outcome outlined in this project.
- 2.3.2 **Should** - The desired function or referenced object may create a favorable environment if achieved but is not required; or an opinion based on the assumptions made by the creator of the function or referenced object.
- 2.3.3 **Credentials** – The required security information to access the application
- 2.3.4 **User** – Any member of the public
- 2.3.5 **Data Store** – An organized collection of information
- 2.3.6 **Published** – Information sent directly to a website viewable to the public
- 2.3.7 **Administrator**- staff member of the Contractor

Nebraska Statewide AI-Powered Resident Assistant

Executive Summary

As residents' expectations for digital services continue to rise, state agencies face increasing pressure to deliver accurate information quickly, securely, and at scale. Artificial intelligence offers a practical tool to modernize public engagement—when deployed within clear operational and compliance safeguards.

Bottom Line: The Nebraska State Records Board (NSRB) can scale a proven AI-powered Resident Assistant statewide, improving public service delivery while maintaining security, transparency, and statutory compliance, while building public trust.

The NSRB-commissioned DMV pilot delivered measurable results within a controlled, policy-aligned environment. In the first three months, more than **38,000 residents** engaged the system, generating **88,000+ inquiries**—an average of nearly **1,000 questions per day**. The pilot demonstrated that AI-enabled service delivery can expand access to accurate information, improve responsiveness, and reduce administrative workload while preserving agency control of content and appropriate human oversight.

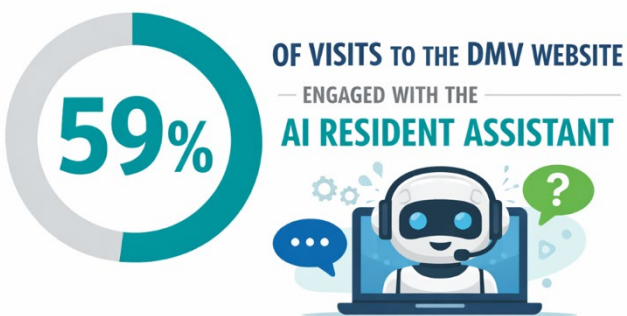
Statewide implementation builds on this foundation by establishing a secure, standardized digital service layer across all agencies. This approach streamlines routine interactions, shortens response times, reduces manual effort, and enhances the resident experience.

By advancing this initiative, the NSRB reinforces its role as both steward of public records and sponsor of secure technology modernization. Statewide deployment modernizes resident engagement, improves operational efficiency, and sets a durable standard for responsible AI adoption in Nebraska.

DMV Pilot Results

The DMV pilot demonstrates that the Tyler Resident Assistant is delivering measurable operational and resident-facing impact in a live production environment. The data reflects sustained, high-volume utilization accompanied by clear efficiency gains across digital and call center channels.

Strong Resident Adoption and Sustained Engagement



During the pilot period, the Resident Assistant handled more than **88,000 questions across 38,000 individual users**. This level of engagement indicates meaningful adoption at scale and demonstrates that residents are actively relying on the tool to obtain DMV information. This usage reflects a 59% engagement rate, meaning that 59% of

visits to the DMV website included interaction with the Resident Assistant.

Website analytics further reinforce this behavioral shift. During the pilot, average time spent on the website declined by 10%, suggesting residents are locating needed information more quickly and navigating fewer pages to resolve their questions. Rather than relying solely on traditional site search and static content, residents are receiving direct responses that allow them to proceed efficiently.

Expanded Access and Equitable Service Delivery

The Resident Assistant broadened access to DMV information in measurable ways. Residents engaged with the system in **50 different languages and dialects**, expanding language accessibility without requiring additional multilingual staffing resources.

Usage patterns also highlight the importance of 24/7 availability. Nearly **19% of all questions were submitted between midnight and 6:00 a.m.** This sustained overnight engagement confirms that residents are seeking information outside standard operating hours and that the Resident Assistant is successfully meeting that demand. The tool extends service availability without increasing workforce requirements.

Measurable Call Volume Reduction

The Nebraska DMV collects call center data for constituents who contact its dedicated call centers. The information presented in this section is derived directly from Nebraska DMV call center records, not from internally generated data. The pilot produced clear operational efficiencies within high-volume divisions:

- **Driver and License Services (DLS)** experienced a **19% reduction in call volume in December** and a **20% reduction in January**.
- The **Vehicle and Record Division** saw an **8% reduction in call volume in January**.

These reductions represent 2847 fewer calls in the months that show a reduction. This meaningful workload relief is estimated to reflect 2-3 FTEs reductions after a longer analysis period concludes. By resolving routine informational inquiries digitally, the Resident Assistant reduces inbound call demand and allows personnel to focus on complex or transaction-specific cases that require direct human support.

Driving Citizens towards Online Services

In addition to answering questions, the Resident Assistant directs residents to relevant high-volume driver license digital service pages when appropriate. Between **February 14 and March 10**, once referral tracking was enabled on 3 of the 30 online services linked to the DMV website, the system generated **3,400 referrals** (37%) to online service pathways.



While referral tracking does not confirm transaction completion, the volume indicates strong engagement with guided digital pathways. Each referral represents an opportunity to shift routine transactions toward self-service options, reduce potential in-office traffic, and streamline the resident journey.

What is offered in a Statewide Implementation?

Under this project, Tyler Technologies will design, implement, and maintain a statewide Resident Assistant model that sources content across the entire Nebraska.gov domain. Unlike the DMV pilot, which was limited to a single agency website, the statewide Resident Assistant will operate as a shared model capable of accessing and producing information

across all Nebraska state websites. This approach creates a unified digital service layer that supports consistent, cross-agency information delivery.

Why is this important?

Citizens don't experience state government as a collection of separate agencies — they experience it as a single entity: *the State of Nebraska*. Yet market research conducted in November 2025 shows that 61% of Nebraskans find navigating government confusing. That confusion leads to frustration, incomplete processes, and increased calls and in-person visits to agencies

A Statewide AI Resident Assistant addresses this gap by organizing information around the citizen's goal — not the government's structure. For example, when a resident asks, "How do I start a business?" the answer doesn't live in just one place. Filing with the Secretary of State is only the first step. Registering for business taxes with the Department of Revenue, understanding state permitting requirements, and reviewing employer obligations to the rest of the state may also be part of the journey.

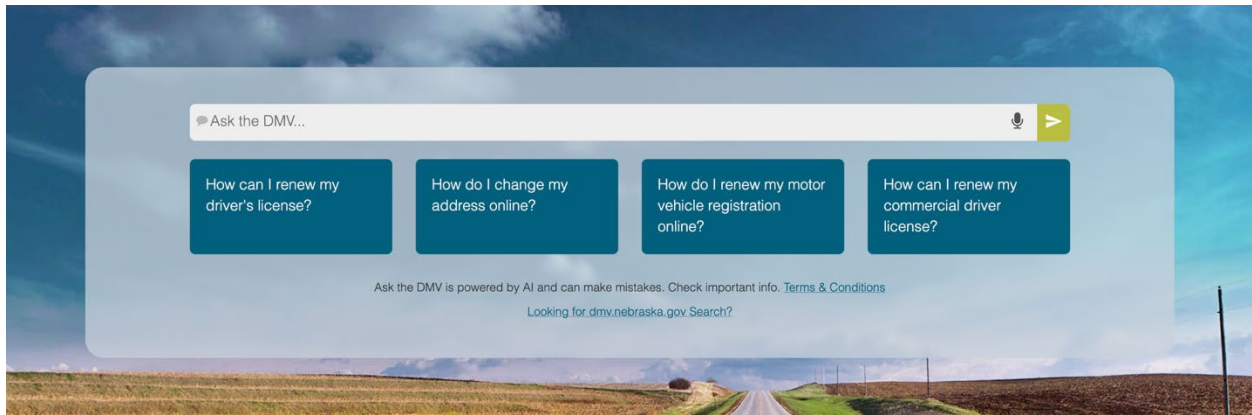
Instead of sending the citizen to multiple agency websites to piece this together themselves, the Statewide AI Resident Assistant provides a coordinated, cross-agency response by design. The result is a clearer path for residents, fewer misdirected inquiries for agencies, and a more modern, unified experience of Nebraska state government.

How does this take shape?

Under the statewide model, Nebraska.gov, which is already the flagship digital front door with over 2.3 million visits per year, will be home to the Tyler Resident Assistant. This approach establishes a unified, resident-facing experience at the state level. As part of this rollout, the NSRB may consider introducing a recognizable public-facing identity—such as "Ask the Sower"—to mirror the successful "Ask the DMV" pilot model. Final naming and branding decisions would remain at the discretion of the NSRB to ensure alignment with statewide communications strategy and policy priorities.

In addition to the Resident Assistant being housed on Nebraska.gov, agencies will have flexibility in how the Resident Assistant is presented on their websites, if they choose. Three standardized interface options will be available:

- A prominently displayed AI interface integrated onto the agency homepage.
- A "Resident Assistant" button embedded within the navigation header
- A persistent popup modal positioned in the lower right-hand corner of webpages



The implementation cost includes the configuration and deployment of the Resident Assistant on agency websites hosted and maintained by Tyler Technologies, including placement on the primary Nebraska.gov homepage. For these agencies, Tyler will manage implementation directly to ensure design consistency and technical integrity.

Agencies whose websites are not hosted by Tyler Technologies will also have access to the Resident Assistant. Tyler will provide the necessary code package and implementation guidance; however, those agencies will be responsible for deploying the solution within their own website environments and applying terms and conditions as set in the contract.

Implementation Approach

The statewide Resident Assistant will be deployed through a structured, phased rollout model designed to ensure disciplined execution, cross-agency alignment, and sustainable governance. The approach builds on the validated DMV pilot framework and introduces a scalable onboarding process to support adoption across multiple state agencies

Phase 1: Planning, Model Creation and Governance Structure

Upon approval, the NSRB will formally launch the statewide initiative and establish clear expectations for execution across participating agencies. In coordination with Tyler, a structured communication and activation plan will be implemented to define participation pathways, technical requirements, and implementation milestones. This activation phase will include a statewide informational briefing, live solution demonstration, and clearly documented technical onboarding procedures to ensure agencies understand both the operational model and their responsibilities.

Tyler Nebraska will leverage experience from prior statewide Resident Assistant deployments to guide the development of a government-focused AI operating model tailored to Nebraska's regulatory and service delivery environment. The initiative will operate under a defined governance framework to ensure disciplined execution, responsible AI implementation, and measurable outcomes.

A designated NSRB Project Champion will serve as executive sponsor, providing statewide leadership and visibility. Oversight will be supported by a cross-agency Steering Committee comprised of the Project Champion, Tyler project leadership, and 5–7 representatives from high-volume agencies. This working group may include technical members, marketing or communications professionals, and members from other key stakeholders such as representatives from the Governor’s office or the OCIO. This body will:

- Establish and maintain the statewide operating framework
- Define performance metrics and adoption benchmarks
- Monitor implementation progress and risk exposure
- Provide strategic direction and issue escalation management

Progress will be governed through structured reporting aligned with state modernization standards. Monthly executive reviews will focus on milestone attainment, risk identification and mitigation, adoption metrics, and measurable performance outcomes. This governance model reinforces accountability, cross-agency alignment, and sustained focus on value realization.

To support orderly rollout, a standardized intake and onboarding framework will capture stakeholder contacts, technical readiness data, integration requirements, and deployment sequencing preferences. This structured intake process will provide the NSRB with real-time visibility into adoption progress, ensure coordinated resource allocation, and maintain implementation momentum across agencies.

Throughout execution, Tyler will lead technical deployment, configuration, and agency enablement activities, while the NSRB retains strategic sponsorship and serves as the visible leader of this statewide modernization initiative.

Phase 2: Nebraska.gov Implementation

Phase 2 transitions the initiative from planning and standards development to statewide implementation on the Nebraska.gov homepage. The policies, governance model, technical standards, and operating framework established in Phase 1 will be operationalized through deployment on Nebraska.gov, creating a unified digital front door for residents seeking statewide information and services.

During this phase, if the governance committee elects to have a public beta period to hone in the model, this will be where we collect and iterate on the public feedback, shaping the assistant into a well-defined model.

This phase positions Nebraska.gov as the authoritative, AI-enabled entry point for cross-agency information access. Rather than operating as a collection of independent agency

resources, the site will serve as a coordinated, resident-centered experience that reflects statewide standards for accessibility, content governance, security, and AI transparency.

Phase 3: Agency Implementation

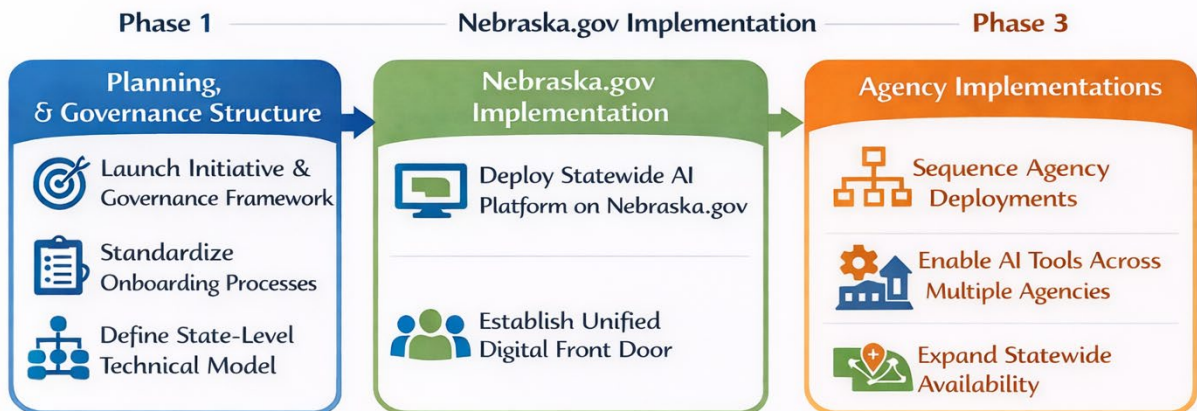
Phase 3 expands the statewide model into participating agency environments. By this point, the Statewide AI Model is considered substantially complete. Building on the governance framework established in Phase 1 and the validated digital front door deployment completed in Phase 2, this phase initiates structured implementation across individual agency websites.

Using the intake data, technical readiness assessments, and prioritization criteria collected during Phase 1, the NSRB and Tyler will develop a sequenced deployment schedule. Agencies will be grouped based on complexity, integration requirements, service volume, and digital maturity to ensure controlled rollout and efficient resource allocation.

The proposed statewide implementation of the Resident Assistant builds on a validated pilot foundation and introduces a disciplined, scalable framework for cross-agency adoption. Through a phased rollout model, structured onboarding process, and clearly defined governance structure, the State can expand this capability in a controlled and repeatable manner.

With executive sponsorship from the NSRB, oversight from a cross-agency steering committee, and ongoing performance monitoring aligned to established pilot metrics, the program is designed for long-term sustainability. This model balances innovation with accountability, enabling Nebraska to modernize resident service delivery while maintaining transparency, security, and governance standards across state government.

RE: Summary of October 29th, 2025 Azure Front Door Outage

Dear Director Elder,

On October 29–30, 2025, a global outage within Microsoft’s Azure Front Door (AFD) infrastructure caused widespread routing and DNS resolution failures across multiple Microsoft cloud services. Engagement Builder, like many enterprise and government platforms hosted in Azure, relies on Azure Front Door as its ingress and traffic routing layer. As a result, the service experienced availability disruption during the incident window.

The outage originated within Microsoft’s control plane configuration processes and occurred upstream of Tyler’s application, database, and security environments. At no point was the disruption caused by Tyler systems, configuration changes, security events, or operational actions. Tyler’s infrastructure remained healthy and secure throughout the event; however, because inbound traffic could not be routed through Azure Front Door, users were temporarily unable to access Engagement Builder.

Incident Overview

Between 15:41 UTC on October 29, 2025, and 00:05 UTC on October 30, 2025 (8 hours and 24 minutes), Microsoft Azure experienced a global service disruption affecting Azure Front Door (AFD) and Azure Content Delivery Network (CDN). Microsoft’s published Post Incident Review attributes the event to a control plane configuration incompatibility that generated invalid customer configuration metadata, resulting in routing instability across multiple regions.

Impact to Engagement Builder

Because Engagement Builder depends on Azure Front Door for domain resolution and traffic routing, the outage occurred upstream of Tyler’s application environment.

- Beginning at 15:41 UTC, users experienced connection timeouts and DNS resolution failures. During this initial phase, Engagement Builder was effectively unavailable.

- Beginning approximately 18:30 UTC, Microsoft’s remediation efforts resulted in gradual service recovery, although some intermittent connectivity and increased latency may have occurred.
- Full service stabilization occurred at 00:05 UTC.

Importantly:

- No data loss occurred.
- No data integrity issues were identified.
- No security breach or unauthorized access occurred.
- Tyler application servers, databases, and internal systems remained operational throughout the incident.

Root Cause (Per Microsoft)

Microsoft determined the root cause to be a sequence of configuration changes performed across different control plane build versions, resulting in incompatible configuration metadata being generated. Microsoft remediated the issue by reverting to a “last known good” configuration, blocking further configuration propagation, and implementing additional safeguards within its control plane processes.

Tyler Response and Remediation Considerations

Upon identifying the issue as Azure infrastructure-related, Tyler Nebraska:

- Confirmed the disruption was isolated to Azure Front Door routing services.
- Monitored Microsoft service health communications in real time.
- Prepared for stakeholder communication as needed.
- Validated system performance and data integrity once routing services were restored.

Because the failure occurred within Microsoft’s global edge routing layer, no direct technical remediation was available to Tyler during the active outage window. Service accessibility was restored only upon Microsoft’s stabilization of Azure Front Door infrastructure.

We remain committed to maintaining resilient and secure digital government services for the State of Nebraska and will continue to monitor vendor infrastructure performance and risk mitigation practices closely.

General Manager's Report

Executive Summary

Tyler Nebraska completed the fourth quarter of 2025 with strong momentum in serving our partners and delivering measurable value to the State and its citizens through modern, efficient online government services. This quarter concludes a highly productive and successful year for Tyler and the State's Online Portal, positioning the portal with significant momentum heading into 2026.

Full-year 2025 financial performance compared to full-year 2024 reflects steady growth and expanding value to the State. Revenue reached \$13.47 million, up 5% year-over-year. More importantly, the State directly benefited through \$1.88 million in revenue share, a 6% increase year-over-year, alongside \$10 million in total cost avoidance, up 4%. Merchant and payment processing growth continued to be a key driver, with fees paid on behalf of the State totaling \$3.73 million. Collectively, these metrics underscore the portal's self-sustaining model and its measurable financial return to the State.

Full-year 2025 project hour allocation underscores the strength of the portal's funding model and its direct financial benefit to the State. Approximately 92% of all project hours were delivered at no direct cost to the State, reflecting the efficiency of the transaction-based structure. The overwhelming majority of these hours were dedicated to self-funded initiatives, with the balance supported through grant-funded efforts, further minimizing fiscal impact to agency partners.

Modernization remained a central strategic priority throughout 2025. All identified services targeted for migration to the Application Platform (AP) have either been successfully launched or are in final testing or change management with agency partners. This transition enhances scalability, strengthens security, and positions the platform for more efficient future enhancements.

The DMV Resident Assistant pilot program launched in 2025 and is currently in active use. Early performance indicators show strong utilization and reliable system performance, with positive engagement from residents. The pilot is delivering tangible value to both users and agency stakeholders, and we are encouraged by the opportunity to evaluate expansion of this service statewide.

Operational performance across the full year remained strong. System uptime was 99.95%, with limited downtime and stable support volumes year-over-year. Customer satisfaction remained high with 95% of respondents reporting satisfaction. Security initiatives aligned with federal cybersecurity guidance and national vulnerability directives, further strengthening the platform's overall risk posture.

Staffing levels remained stable at 23 team members, with no departures or open positions in the final quarter, reinforcing operational continuity and institutional strength. As we move into 2026, the portal is exceptionally well positioned for continued expansion, innovation, and statewide impact. With a modernized platform foundation, strong financial performance, proven value delivery to the State, and emerging services like the DMV Resident Assistant gaining traction, Tyler Nebraska enters the new year with clear momentum and a disciplined path toward scaling digital services that further enhance efficiency, accessibility, and measurable return for the State and its citizens.

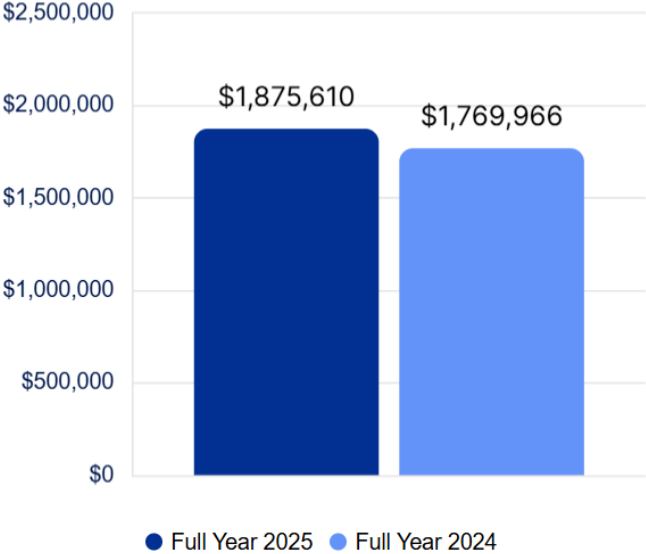

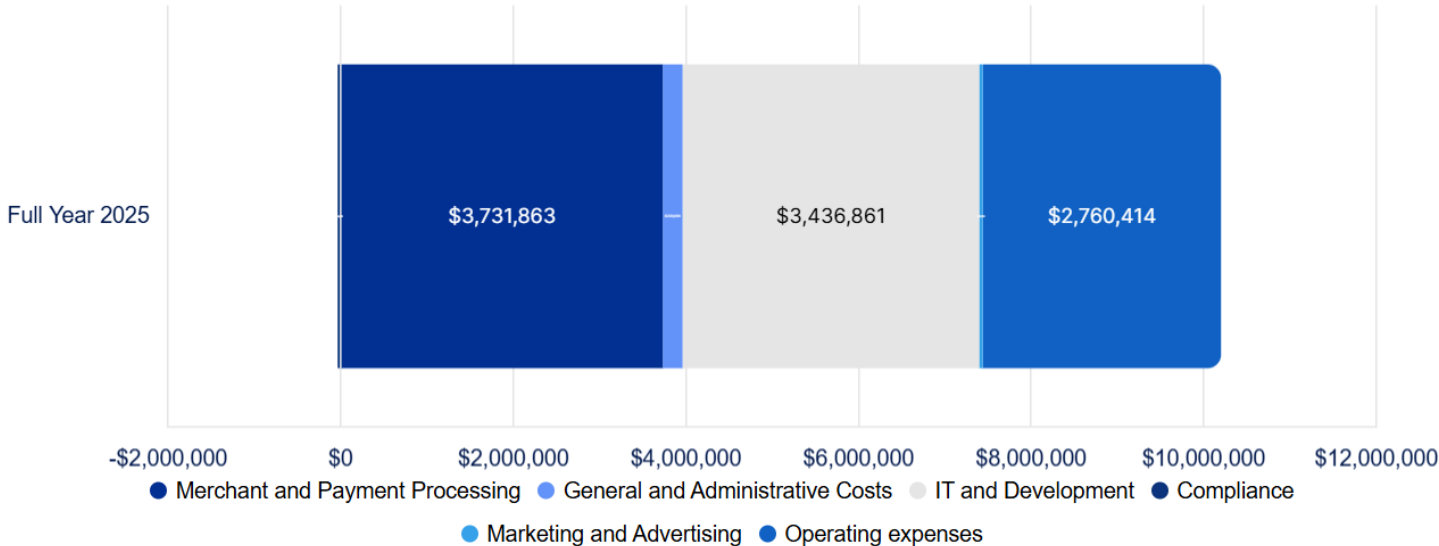

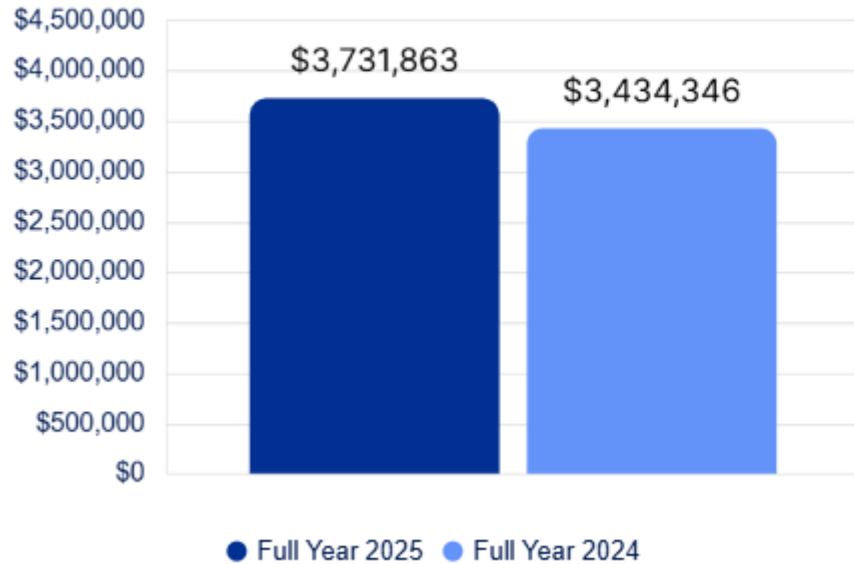
State Cost Avoidance

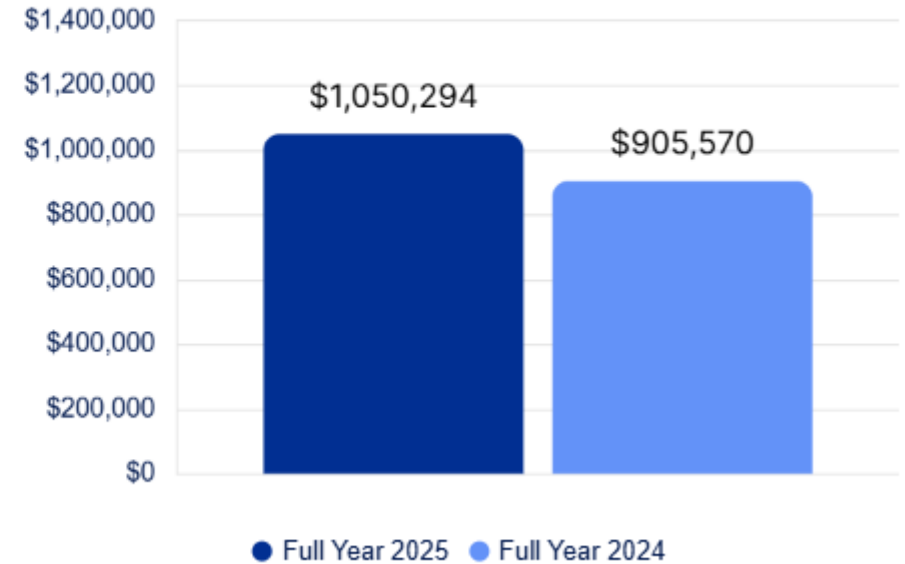

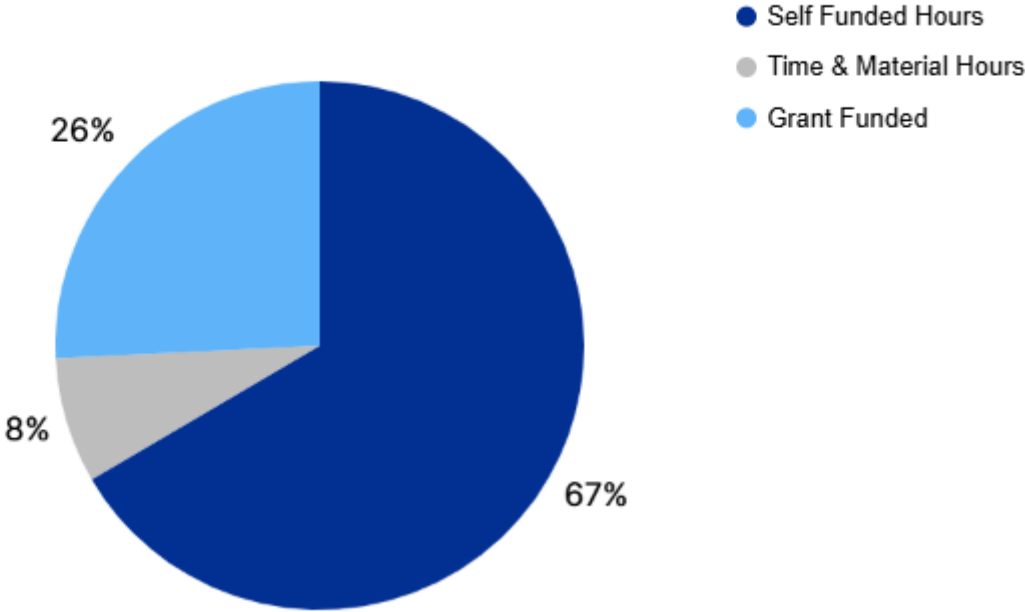
Tyler NE Net Profit

Full Year 2025 Project Funding



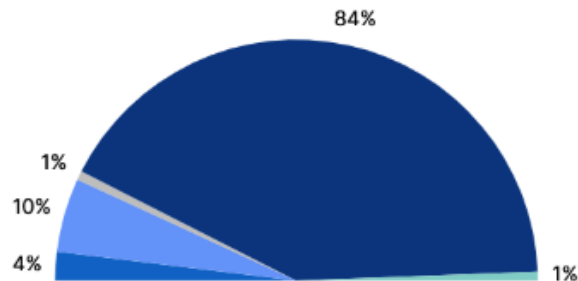

Time and materials are paid for and included in an SOW agreement with the partner by hourly development rates (such as websites). Revenue hours are billed for services such as content management requests. These totals include development hours only.

Grant-funded hours are non-tax appropriated funds acquired through the NCHIP/NARIP grant in conjunction with the Nebraska State Patrol.

Hours allocated for modernization upgrades are allocated as "self-funded" hours. In 2025, 92% of all hours came at no direct cost to the State.

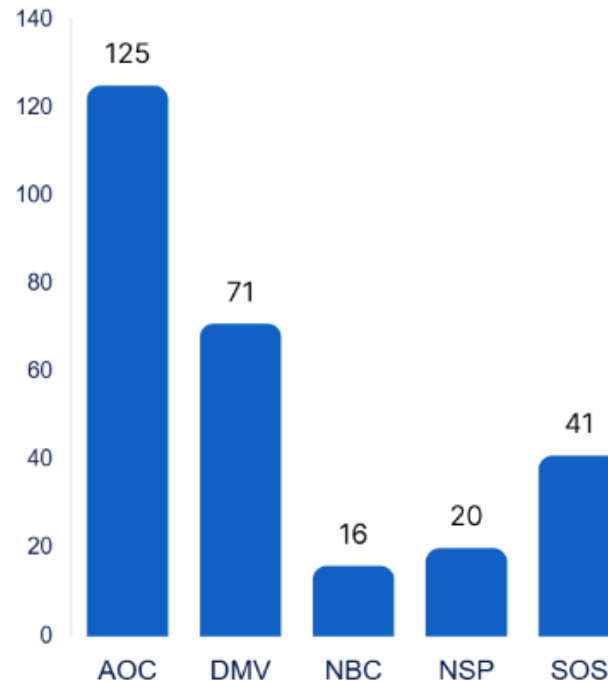

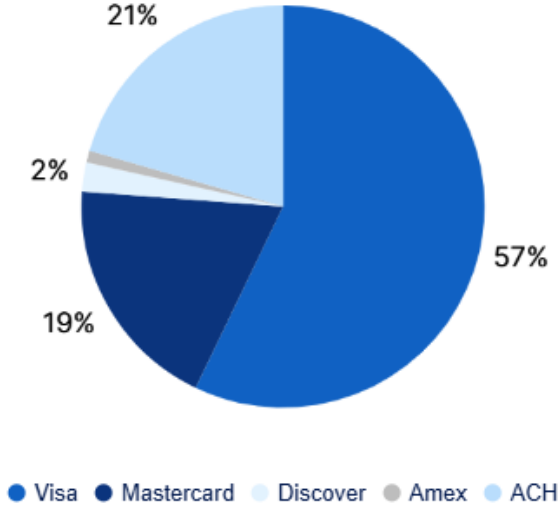
Tyler Nebraska provides first-line support for all online services.

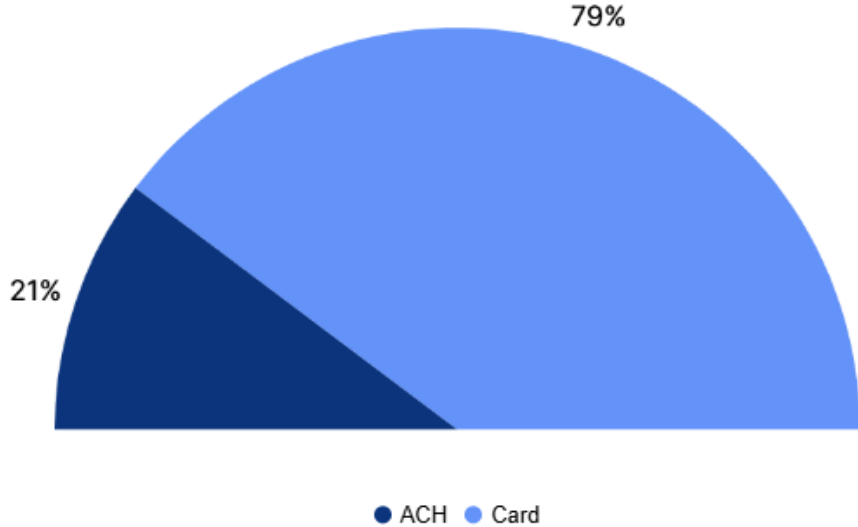
State agency partners can conveniently submit support requests through the Tyler Nebraska Support Portal, while Nebraska residents have multiple contact options, including phone, email, and online chat.

Security Update

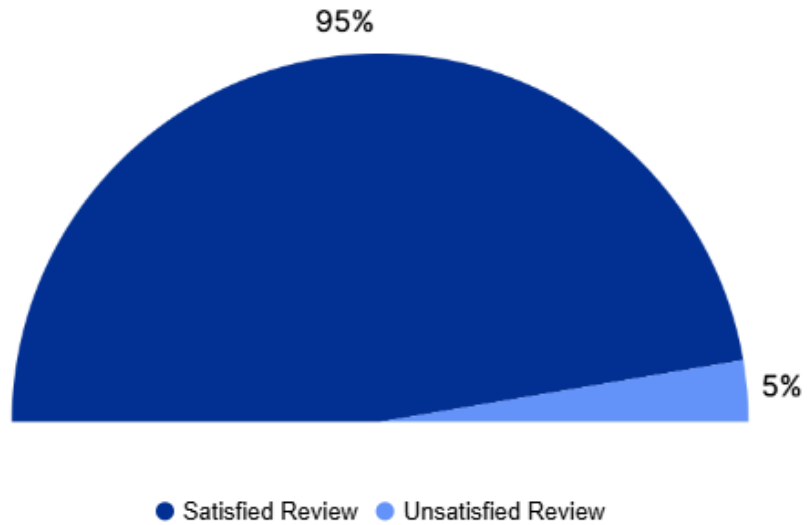
During the fourth quarter of 2025, U.S. federal cyber defense partners emphasized that critical infrastructure risk is often driven by basic exposure issues, not just sophisticated malware. On December 9, 2025, a joint advisory warned that pro Russia hacktivist groups were conducting opportunistic attacks against U.S. and global critical infrastructure. The advisory highlighted that some activity was enabled by easily reachable remote access tools, including internet facing VNC, which is a way to control another computer's screen over a network as if you were sitting in front of it, and noted that targeted sectors included Water and Wastewater Systems, Food and Agriculture, and Energy.

This quarter also brought new federal guidance that is directly relevant to government identity and access management as more services move online. NIST released an initial public draft of NIST IR 8587, which focuses on protecting identity tokens and related assertions from theft, forgery, and misuse. The draft guidance highlights practical steps such as limiting how long tokens remain valid and ensuring organizations can revoke and replace tokens quickly when accounts or systems change. In plain terms, an identity token is a digital pass that systems use to confirm a user has already signed in, so they can access applications and services without repeatedly entering credentials.

AI's influence on security also remained a prominent theme in Q4 reporting and guidance. Microsoft's Digital Defense Report 2025 described how generative AI can make social engineering and fraud easier to scale by helping produce convincing content more quickly and tailor messages to specific targets. The report also discusses the rise of "ClickFix," a social engineering technique that tricks users into taking a manual action that enables follow on compromise, and notes that defenders are responding by using AI to help triage larger volumes of security signals, identify suspicious patterns sooner, and speed up investigation and response workflows.

In an effort to continuously improve our customer support, Tyler Nebraska has implemented a customer service rating system for users submitting support tickets. After a ticket is resolved, users are prompted to provide feedback through a satisfaction rating, indicating either "satisfied" or "unsatisfied," along with the option to leave additional comments.

This feedback is captured and monitored using our ZenDesk support platform, allowing us to regularly review and assess service performance.

In Full Year 2025, Tyler Nebraska received ratings on 2,108 support tickets, achieving an overall satisfaction score of 94.6%. This rating reflects our commitment to providing excellent customer service and addressing user needs effectively.

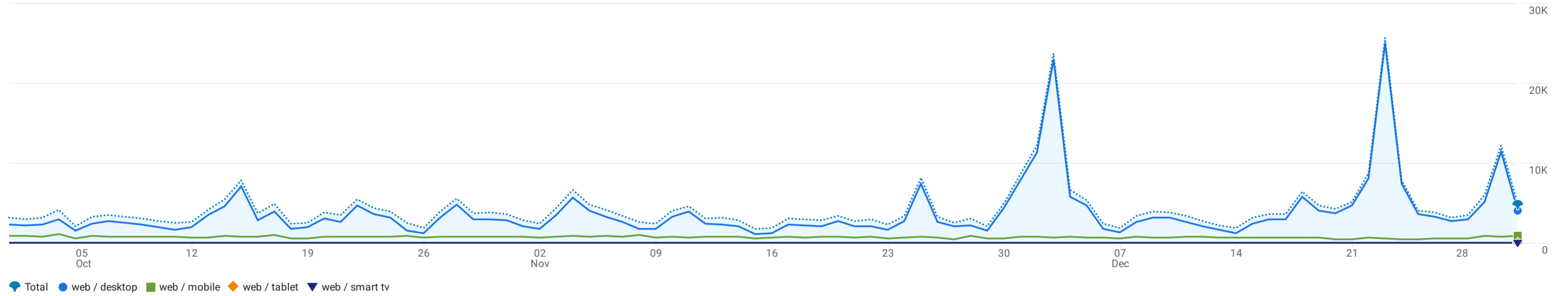

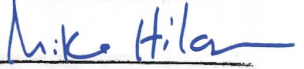

OPINION FOR THE STATE AUDITOR

**Lawfulness of Transition Periods in
State Contracts**

Summary: Neb. Rev. Stat. § 73-812(2) prohibits state agencies from amending contracts to extend their duration for a term longer than half of the original contract period. A contractual “transition period,” wherein a contractor continues to provide services *after* the expiration of a contract to help the State transition to a new contract, does not violate § 73-812. Such period, if exercised in good faith, is neither an amendment nor an extension to the contract.

You requested our opinion “regarding the proper interpretation of” Neb. Rev. Stat. § 73-812(2). Specifically, your request concerned the application of that statute to a potential “transition period” under the contract between the State Records Board (the “Board”) and Nebraska Interactive, LLC (the “Interactive Contract” or the “Contract”) for the management and administration of the State’s online information portal (the “Portal”).

I.

At the outset, I write to explain the issuance of this opinion in the first instance, as it is a request from a single member of a multiple-member board. As State Auditor, you are statutorily designated as a member of the Board. Neb. Rev. Stat. § 84-1204(2)(c). The other members of the Board are: (1) the Secretary of State, designated as the State Records Administrator; (2) the Governor or his or her designee; (3) the Attorney General or his or her designee; (4) the State Treasurer or his or her designee; (5) the

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Director of Administrative Services or his or her designee; (6) three representatives appointed by the Governor to represent banking, insurance, and law groups; and (7) three representatives appointed by the Governor representing libraries, the general public, and professional members of the Nebraska news media. Neb. Rev. Stat. §§ 84-1203, 84-1204(2).

In the case of multi-member boards or commissions, our policy has been—as a general matter—to issue opinions only if formal action is taken by the body to request our opinion. *See* Op. Att’y Gen. No. 23-010 (Dec. 15, 2023). With respect to such boards or commissions, we represent and advise the body, not each individual member. Thus, everything else being equal, we usually do not provide an opinion based on the request of an individual member.

Everything, however, is not equal. The Attorney General is required to give “his or her opinion in writing upon all questions of law submitted to him or her by the Governor, head of any executive department, Secretary of State, State Treasurer, Auditor of Public Accounts, Board of Educational Lands and Funds, State Department of Education, Public Service Commission, or the Legislature” Neb. Rev. Stat. § 84-205(4). We issue opinions to executive branch officials and agencies “upon questions of law which arise ‘in the discharge of their duties.’” *See* Op. Att’y Gen. No. 137 at 1 (Dec. 24, 1985) (quoting *Follmer v. State*, 94 Neb. 217 (1913)) (explaining this requirement as applied to members of the Legislature). And where, as here, a request emanates from an office created under our Constitution and is related to the office’s constitutional duties, we find we have authority to issue a formal opinion. *See, e.g.*, Op. Att’y Gen. No. 15-010 (Aug. 10, 2015) (issuing a formal opinion to the Treasurer respecting the authority of the Records Board); Op. Att’y Gen. No. 09-003 (Jan. 27, 2009) (same). At a minimum, we conclude that your

request relates to your duties as State Auditor. See generally Op. Att'y Gen. No. 93-012 (Mar. 4, 1993) (explaining the inherent constitutional duties of the State Auditor).

II.

Having addressed the propriety of issuing this written opinion, we now turn to the question itself. Your request inquired about the proper interpretation and application of Neb. Rev. Stat. § 73-812(2), which is part of the State Procurement Act. Specifically, you asked:

Would exercising a contract extension or a renewal option, or both, provided in the original agreement preclude ... subsequent utilization of a "transition period" also authorized by the original agreement? ... The same question is posed regarding the propriety of exercising the "transition period" provision after a contract renewal, whether alone or in conjunction with a consecutive or successive extension.

We analyze only the legal question presented to us. This opinion does not address the policy question of whether the Board *should* exercise a contract extension or transition period under the Interactive Contract or any other contract.

We find that Neb. Rev. Stat. § 73-812(2) does not preclude the Board from exercising a contractual "transition period," including after a contract has already been extended. Neb. Rev. Stat. § 73-812(2) provides that no state "contract shall be amended to extend the duration of the contract for a period of more than fifty percent of the initial contract term." The same section clarifies that it "does not prohibit the exercise of any renewal option

expressly provided in the original contract.” *Id.* The Department of Administrative Services has explained the difference between a “renewal” and an “extension”: a “renewal” “must be specifically named in the original solicitation or contract,” where “‘extensions’ are available to all State of Nebraska Contracts,” regardless of whether contemplated by the original terms of the contract. State Purchasing Bureau Policy 24-04, DAS (July 18, 2024), <https://perma.cc/W6X8-GPCP>.

A “transition period” is not mentioned in Nebraska statute but is a creature of contract. Under the Interactive Contract, the Board can require Nebraska Interactive to continue operating the Portal for up to 30 months after expiration of the Contract. The purpose is to ensure “the Portal remain[s] fully operational during the transition to a Subsequent Contractor upon termination or expiration” and to facilitate an “orderly transition of services.” Interactive Contract, § R at 36.

For at least two reasons, we find that the Board’s use of the transition period (even after an extension) would not violate Neb. Rev. Stat. § 73-812(2). *First*, the transition period is contemplated by the terms of the Contract. Like a renewal option, the transition clause was hammered out during the bid and negotiation process. The “transition” would not extend performance under the Contract beyond what was bid and negotiated; thus, it is not an “amend[ment] to extend” the Contract under Neb. Rev. Stat. § 73-812(2). *Second*, the transition period occurs *after* the contract “terminat[es] or expir[es],” as opposed to an extension which delays the termination or expiration of the Contract. Courts have recognized that “phase-in, phase-out services” do not “extend” contracts beyond termination, nor do they cause a contract’s duration to extend beyond legal limits. *See Arko Exec. Servs., Inc. v. United States*, 553 F.3d 1375, 1380–81 (Fed. Cir. 2009); *Comerica Bank v. Glob. Payments Direct, Inc.*, No. CIV.A. 9707-CB, 2014 WL

3567610, at *11 (Del. Ch. July 21, 2014). Indeed, federal regulations expressly permit a transitional period for federal contracts. See 48 C.F.R. § 37.111. For good reason. When a government contract terminates or expires, it could harm the government if contractor services had to immediately shut down. Here, the State could lose access to the Portal. Thus, a transition period (exercised in good faith) is not an attempt to extend a contract beyond statutory limits, but prudent planning to ensure continuity of valuable government services from one contract to the next.

The analysis does not change if the “transition period” is utilized after a contract *renewal*. As mentioned, the transition period is triggered only after expiration or termination of the Contract. If the Contract expires or terminates after a renewal, we see no reason why a “transition period” would transform into an “extension” of the Contract. Whether after a renewal, an extension, or both, a negotiated period of transition is not an “amend[ment] to extend” a contract and does not trigger until after expiration or termination of the contract.

To be sure, merely labeling something as a “transition period” does not free the State from § 73-812(2)’s requirements. The State Procurement Act provides an anti-loophole provision: “State agencies shall not structure contracts to avoid any of the requirements of the State Procurement Act.” Neb. Rev. Stat. § 73-812(3). So, for example, if an agency agreed mid-contract to an indefinite “transition period” that allowed the parties to extend the contract in perpetuity, that would likely be an unlawful work-around of the duration limits under § 73-812(2). But where, as under the Interactive Contract, the “transition period” is a good-faith transition from one contract to the next, we do not think the period violates § 73-812(2).

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III.

A contractual “transition period”—bargained for and exercised in good faith—is not an amendment to extend the contract. Thus, it does not violate Neb. Rev. Stat. § 73-812(2).

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
